No bid shall be withdrawn for a period of thirty (30) days after the bid opening date without the consent of the Village. Successful bidder must provide proper insurance. **Each contractor is to submit their bid as indicated in the Specifications and include all signed supporting documents.**

The Village reserves the right to reject any or all proposals and to waive any informality in bidding.

Award of Contract: The Village of Oswego Board of Trustees will make the final award of the proposal. The successful bidder and the Village will execute a contract mutually agreeable to both parties within 14 days from the award of contract.

INTRODUCTION

For the purchase and installation of Police Computers and Equipment Package

Purpose of Request:

The intent of this proposal is to obtain competitive pricing to purchase and install laptops, docking stations, mounting equipment, and peripherals in police vehicles in accordance with the specifications contained herein. Only responsive and responsible Contractors will be considered for award of this Request for Proposal (RFP).

Project Description:

The Village is requesting a proposal to equip twenty-one (21) squad vehicles with laptops, docking stations, mounting equipment, and peripherals in accordance with the specifications contained herein. The Village requests separate proposals for each option. The Village reserves the right the separate bid proposals and award business to one or multiple vendors.

PROJECT SPECIFICATIONS

Detailed Specifications:

Scope of Work: Proposals may be submitted for one or more Base Bid Packages. It is the intent to receive the lowest bid for each Base Bid Package, therefore this entire RFP shall not bind the Village to one vendor. Each Base Bid Package is solely separate from the other. The Village will prepare separate contracts with the lowest responsible bidder(s) for each Base Bid Package.

The Village is requesting proposals for the following:

Base Bid Package #1 – Computers and Docking Stations: The Village is interested in two (2) different computer models and request bids for twenty-two (22) units based on the specs below. Contractor may bid one or both computer models, but must bid both a computer and matching docking station in order for their bid to be valid. It is the intent of the Village to award a contract for only one brand of computer. The Village requires that the 22 computers be imaged to the Village's configuration specifications.

Base Bid Package #2 – Havis Mounting Equipment: The Village has worked with Havis and is requesting pricing for equipment that will outfit each vehicle based on its make and model. It is the intent of the Village to award a contract to one contractor for the entire mounting package specified as Base Bid #2. The Village reserves the right to delete vehicles and their requested equipment should they no longer be in service.

Base Bid Package #3 – Installation of Computers, Mounting Equipment and Network Hardware: The installing Contractor will supply all equipment such as cables, fasteners, and any other items that will be needed to install into each vehicle. The specified equipment for each vehicle is shown in the bid sheet. In addition to the mounting equipment, Contractor will install the network equipment in each vehicle.

The Village expects the Contractor installing the equipment to be able to pick up and deliver vehicles in a timely manner. The Village's vehicles are used daily therefore the Contractor acknowledges that only one vehicle can be worked on at a time.

The Public Works facility garage may be available for Village installations under this Contract, subject to the approval of the Public Works Director. Hours of operation at our Public Works garage are Monday through Friday, 7AM to 3PM. Contractor shall indicate a credit value for use of the Village's facilities. Installs may be increased to more than one per day if using the Village's facilities.

Contractor has sixty (60) days after notification after receipt of the notice to proceed from the Village to complete the installation of all 21 squad cars specified.

Base Bid Package #4 – Networking Hardware: The Village requires a Cradlepoint router for each squad car, 21 in total. The router must be compatible with Verizon's multiple PDN's (Packet Data Network) and AT&T FirstNet infrastructure. The compatible router is the **Cradlepoint IBR900-600M**. Along with the routers, the Village is requiring four (4) Cradlepoint COR Extensibility Docks for our Hot Seat squads. Each squad car will be upgrading their antennas as well. The Village is requiring an Antenna that will work with AT&T and Verizon Cellular/LTE frequencies now and into the future. With AT&T's FirstNet network, the antenna needs to support Band 14. The antenna will also need to support MiMo 2G/3G/4G with GPS/GNSS and MiMo 2.4/5.0 GHz.

Joint Purchasing: The Village of Oswego (Village) and The United City of Yorkville (City) have entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement regarding joint employment of a Purchasing Manager. The Purchasing Manager works to streamline and manage the purchasing of both municipalities. If requested, Contractor agrees to sell items or perform services offered in this RFP at the same pricing for both municipalities. Contractor also agrees to execute a separate contract with the City at the Council's requests.

Billing/Invoicing: All billing and invoicing can be periodic with detailed itemized billing. Billing will include the date, the item supplied with serial numbers, if applicable, and the total cost. After receipt of a correct invoice, payments shall be due and owing by the Village in accordance with the terms and provisions of the Local Government Prompt Payment Act, Illinois Compiled Statutes, Ch. 50, Sec. 505, et. seq.;

If, in the opinion of the Village, the Contractor has not or is not satisfactorily performing the work covered by this specification, and within forty eight (48) hours of receipt of a written demand from the Village, for performance, has not cured any defect in performance specifically itemized in such demand, the Village may, at its option:

- a) Withhold payment.
- b) Consider all or any part of this contract breached and terminate the contractor, or
- c) May hire another contractor to cure any defects in performance or complete all work covered by this specification for the remaining term of this contract.
- d) Any demand for performance shall be specifically delivered to contractor by personal delivery, certified or registered mail.

The Village will make periodic inspections and follow up as needed with the contractor to discuss any issues, etc.

Financial Consequences: The Village will withhold 3% of the total payment to the Contractor if the goods are not received by the Village by the date specified on the Purchase order.

Discontinued Items/Product Equivalents/Product Additions: Should any item, as specified in the Bid price sheet, become discontinued it shall be removed and replaced by an equivalent model upon written approval from the IT Manager and purchasing office. Written approval from the IT Manager and purchasing office will also be required for any additional needed items (relating only to laptop equipment & peripherals) that are not specified below, however the items are to be given a percentage discount matching the price sheet.

Warranties/Damaged Items/Delivery: The Contractor shall assume full responsibility for providing or ensuring warranty coverage and/or warranty service on any and all items including labor, goods, materials, or equipment provided to the Village. If the successful Bidder is not the Manufacturer, all Manufacturer warranties must be passed through to the Village. The Contractor shall assume full responsibility for replacement of all defective or damaged goods within thirty (30) days of notice by the Village of such defect or damage. Delivery shall be made no later than the specified Delivery Date. The Contractor shall pay all costs associated with delivery and shall assume full responsibility for all item(s) damaged prior to the F.O.B. destination delivery and agree to hold harmless the Village of all responsibility for prosecuting damage claims.

Guarantee: If products do not comply with the specifications contained herein, the Contractor shall replace the product(s) or the purchase price shall be refunded. The refund or the delivery of the replacement product(s) shall be made within thirty (30) days following the Purchasing Manager's notification to the Bidder that the original product(s) was non-compliant. Costs of returning the original product(s) will be the sole responsibility of the Contractor.

Supporting/Supplemental Information: The Village requires that bidders submit all required technical, specification, and other supporting information with their bid, so that a detailed analysis and determination can be made by the Purchasing and IT Manager that the product/service offered meets this RFP's specifications and that other requirements of this RFP have been met. However, provided a bid meets the requirements for a definite, firm, unqualified, and unconditional offer, the Village reserves the right to request supplemental information from the bidder, after the bids have been opened, to ensure that the products/services offered completely meet this RFP's requirements. The requirement for such supplemental information will be at the reasonable discretion of the Village and may include the requirement that a bidder will provide a sample product(s) so that the Village can make a first-hand examination and determination.

Instructions to Bidders

1. **Receipt of Bid: March 8, 2018; 10:00 A.M.**
2. **Basis of Bid:** Sealed bids will be received until the above noted time and date.
3. **Bid Description: The purchase and installation of Police Computers and Equipment**
4. **Preparation and Submission of bids:**
 - A. Each bid shall be submitted on the exact form furnished. All blank spaces for bid prices, unit costs and alternates must be filled in using both words and figures if indicated. In case of any discrepancy in the amount bid, the prices expressed in written words shall govern.
 - B. Each bidder must complete, execute and submit with its bid a certification that Bidder is not barred from public contracting due to bid-rigging or bid rotating convictions on the form included with the bidding documents.
 - C. **Each bidder must submit a complete bid package, including the following items:**
 - i. **Bid Certifications**
 - ii. **Bid Sheet**
 - iii. **Bid Sheet Signature**
 - iv. **Contractor's Bid Agreement**
 - v. **References**
 - vi. **Subcontractors List**
 - vii. **Completed W-9**
 - D. One (1) paper copy of the bid and one electronic version of the bid on a flash drive in a *.pdf (Adobe Acrobat) version shall be submitted in a sealed envelope on or before the time stated and shall bear the name of the individual, firm, or corporation submitting the Bid and the Bid Name – Police Computers, Equipment, and Installation
 - E. **Bidders may attach separate** sheets to the bid for the purpose of explanation, exception, alternate bid and to cover unit prices, if needed.
 - F. Bidders may withdraw their bid either personally or by written request at any time before the hour set for the bid opening, and may resubmit it. No bid may be withdrawn or modified after the bid opening except where the award of contract has been delayed for a period of more than ninety (90) days.
 - G. In submitting this bid, the bidder further declares that the only person or party interested in the proposal as principals are those named herein; and that the bid is made without collusion with any other person, firm or corporation.
 - H. The bidder further declares that he has carefully examined this entire Bid Package, and he has familiarized himself with all of the local conditions affecting the contract and the detailed requirements of this work and understands that in making the bid he waives all rights to plead a misunderstanding regarding same.
 - I. The bidder further understands and agrees that if his bid is accepted, he is to furnish and provide all necessary machinery, tools, apparatus, and other means to do all of the work and to furnish all of the materials specified in the contract, except such materials as are to be furnished by the owner (Village), in the manner and at the time therein prescribed, and in accordance with the requirements therein set forth.
 - J. The bidder further agrees that if the Village decides to extend or shorten the work, or otherwise alters it by extras or deductions, including elimination of one or more of the items, as provided in the specifications, he will perform the work as altered, increased or decreased.
 - K. The bidder further agrees that the Village representative may at any time during the progress of the work covered by this Contract, order other work or materials incidental thereto and that all such work and materials as do not appear in the bid or contract as a specific item covered by a lump sum price, and which are not included under the bid price for other items in the Contract, shall be performed as extra work.
 - L. The bidder further agrees to execute all documents within this Bid Package, for this work and present all of these documents to the Village.

- M. The bidder further agrees to execute all documents within this Bid Package, obtain a Certificate of Insurance for this work and present all of these documents within fifteen (15) days after the receipt of the Notice of Award and the Contract.
- N. The bidder further agrees to begin work not later than ten (10) days after receipt of the Notice to Proceed, unless otherwise provided, and to execute the work in such a manner and with sufficient materials, equipment and labor as will insure its completion within the time limit specified within the bid, it being understood and agreed that the completion within the time limit is an essential part of the contract.
- O. By submitting a bid, the bidder understands and agrees that, if his bid is accepted, and he fails to enter into a contract forthwith, he shall be liable to the Village for any damages the Village may thereby suffer.
- P. No bid will be considered unless the party offering it shall furnish evidence satisfactory to the Village that he has necessary facilities, ability and pecuniary resources to fulfill the conditions of the Contract.
- Q. No bid shall be considered unless the party offering it shall furnish evidence satisfactory to the Village that he has the necessary facilities, ability, and pecuniary resources to fulfill the conditions of the Contract.

Answers will be provided in writing to all potential Bidders on Monday, March 5, 2018; No oral comments will be made to any Bidder as to the meaning of the RFP and Specifications or other contract documents. Bidders will not be relieved of obligations due to failure to examine or receive documents, visit the site or become familiar with conditions or facts of which the Bidder should have been aware of and the Village will reject all claims related thereto.

Information (other than in the form of a written Addendum issued by the Village) from any officer, agent, or employee of the Village or any other person shall not affect the risks or obligations assumed by the Bidder or relieve him from fulfilling any of the conditions and obligations set forth in the proposal and other contract documents. Before the proposals are opened, all modification or additions to the proposal documents will be made in the form of a written Addendum issued by the Village. Any Addendum issued will be posted on the Village's website. In the event of conflict with the original contract documents, addenda shall govern all other contract documents to the extent specified. Subsequent addenda shall govern over prior addenda only to the extent specified.

The Bidder shall be required to acknowledge receipt of the formal Addendum by signing the Addendum and including it with the proposal quotation. Failure of a Bidder to include a signed formal Addendum in its proposal quotation shall deem its quotation non-responsive: provided, however that the Village may waive this requirement if it in its best interest.

6. **Conditions:**
- A. The Village is exempt from Federal excise tax and the Illinois Retailer's Occupation Tax. This bid cannot include any amounts of money for these taxes.
 - B. To be valid, the bids shall be itemized so that selection for purchase may be made, there being included in the price of each unit the cost of delivery (FOB Destination).
 - C. The Village shall reserve the right to add or to deduct from the base bid and/or alternate bid any item at the prices indicated in itemization of the bid.
 - D. All bids shall be good for ninety (90) days from the date of the bid opening.

7. **Award of Bid:** The Village of Oswego reserves the right to reject any or all bids and to waive any informality or technical error and to accept any bid(s) deemed most favorable to the interests of the Village of Oswego.
- A. The items of work not specifically mentioned in the Schedule which are necessary and required to complete the work intended shall be done incidental to and as part of the items of work for which a unit price is given. No additional payment will be made for such incidental work. The Bidder shall be responsible for

identifying all costs to complete the project on time and in order to create a functional and operational system in accordance with the Plans and Specifications.

B. All awards made in accordance with this Code are final determinations.

C. In addition to price, the Village will consider:

- Ability, capacity and skill to fulfill the contract as specified.
- Proximity of the installation contractor to the Village
- Ability to supply the commodities, provide the services or complete the construction promptly, or within the time specified, without delay or interference.
- Character, integrity, reputation, judgment, experience and efficiency.
- Quality of performance on previous contracts.
- Previous and existing compliance with laws and ordinances relating to the contract.
- Sufficiency of financial resources.
- Quality, availability and adaptability of the commodities, services or construction, in relation to the Village's requirements.
- Ability to provide future maintenance and service under the contract.
- Number and scope of conditions attached to the bid/proposal.
- Record of payments for taxes, licenses or other monies due the Village

8. **Rejection of Bids:**

A. The Village reserves the right to cancel invitations for bids or requests for proposals without penalty when it is in the best interest of the Village. Notice of cancellation shall be sent to all individuals or entities solicited.

B. The Village reserves the right to reject any or all bids, to waive any minor informality or irregularity in any bid, to negotiate changes and/or modifications with the lowest responsible bidder and to make award to the response deemed to be the most advantageous to the Village. Bidders shall be required to comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, including those relating to employment of labor without discrimination on the basis of age, race, color handicap, sex, national origin or religious creed.

C. Any bid not conforming to the specifications or requirements set forth by the Village in the bid request may be rejected.

D. Bids may also be rejected if they are made by a bidder that is deemed un-responsible due to a lack of qualifications, capacity, skill, character, experience, reliability, financial stability or quality of services, supplies, materials, equipment or labor.

9. **Equal Opportunity:** The Bidder will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, ancestry, national origin, place of birth, age or handicap unrelated to bona fide occupational qualifications.

10. **Non-Discrimination:** The Bidder, its employees and subcontractors, agrees not to commit unlawful discrimination and agrees to comply with applicable provisions of the Illinois Human Rights Act, the U.S. Civil Rights Act and Section 504 of the Federal Rehabilitation Act, and rules applicable to each.

11. **Copies of Documents:** The number of copies of Contract and Bond required to be executed is as follows:

Three (3) original counterparts of the Contract documents will be required to be executed.

12. **Execution of Documents:** The Bidder, in signing his Bid on the whole or on any portion of the work, shall conform to the following requirements:

Bids signed by an individual other than the individual represented in the Bid documents shall have attached thereto a power of attorney evidencing authority to sign the Bid in the name of the person for whom it is signed.

Bids which are signed for a partnership shall be signed by all of the partners or by an attorney-in-fact. If signed by an attorney-in-fact, there shall be attached to the Bid a power of attorney evidencing authority to sign the bid, executed by the partners.

Bids which are signed for a corporation shall have the correct corporate name thereof and the signature of the President or other authorized officer of the corporation manually written below the corporate name.

If such Bid is manually signed by an official other than the President of the Corporation, a certified copy of a resolution of the board of directors evidencing the authority of such official to sign the Bid should be attached to it. Such Bid shall also bear the attesting signature of the Secretary of the corporation and the impression of the corporate seal.

The Contract shall be deemed as have been awarded when formal notice of award shall have been duly served upon the intended awardee.

13. **Independent Contractor:** There is no employee/employer relationship between the Contractor and the Village. Contractor is an independent contractor and not the Village's employee for all purposes, including, but not limited to, the application of the Fair Labor Standards Act minimum wage and overtime payments, Federal Insurance Contribution Act, the Social Security Act, the Federal Unemployment Tax Act, the Worker's Compensation Act (820 ILCS 305/1, et seq.). The Village will not (i) provide any form of insurance coverage, including but not limited to health, worker's compensation, professional liability insurance, or other employee benefits, or (ii) deduct any taxes or related items from the monies paid to Contractor. The performance of the services described herein shall not be construed as creating any joint employment relationship between the Contractor and the Village, and the Village is not and will not be liable for any obligations incurred by the Contractor, including but not limited to unpaid minimum wages and/or overtime premiums, nor does there exist an agency relationship or partnership between the Village and the Contractor.
14. **Approval and Use of Subcontractors:** The Contractor shall perform the Services with its own personnel and under the management, supervision, and control of its own organization unless otherwise approved by the Village in writing. All subcontractors and subcontracts used by the Contractor shall be included on the Subcontractor's form in the Bid proposal and be acceptable to, and approved in advance by the Village. The Village's approval of any subcontractor or subcontract shall not relieve the Contractor of full responsibility and liability for the provision, performance, and completion of the Work in full compliance with, and as required by or pursuant to, this Contract. If the Contractor chooses to use subcontractors to perform any of the Work, the Work performed under any subcontract shall be subject to all of the provisions of this Contract in the same manner as if performed by employees of the Contractor. Every reference in this Contract to "Contractor" shall be deemed to also apply to all subcontractors of the Contractor. Every subcontract entered into by the Contractor to provide the Work or any part thereof shall include a provision binding the subcontractor to all provisions of this Contract.

If any personnel or subcontractor fail to perform the part of the Work undertaken by it in a manner satisfactory to the Village, the Contractor shall immediately upon notice from the Village remove and replace such personnel or subcontractor. The Village shall have no claim for damages, for compensation in excess of the contract price, or for a delay or extension of the contract time as a result of any such removal or replacement.
15. **Assignment:** Neither the Village nor the Contractor shall assign or transfer any rights or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.
16. **Governing Law:** This Contract and the rights of Owner and Consultant under this Contract shall be interpreted according to the internal laws, but not the conflict of laws rules, of the State of Illinois. Venue for any action related to this Contract will be in the Circuit Court of Kendall County, Illinois.
17. **Changes in Law:** Unless otherwise explicitly provided in this Contract, any reference to laws shall include such laws as they may be amended or modified from time to time.
18. **Time:** The Contract Time is of the essence of this Contract. Except where otherwise stated, references in this Contract to days shall be construed to refer to calendar days.

CONTRACT

The entire bid package and following sections apply to all proposals requested and accepted by the Village and become a part of the contract unless otherwise specified. Persons submitting proposals or their authorized representatives are expected to fully inform themselves as to the conditions, requirements, and specifications before submitting proposals. The Village assumes that submission of a proposal means that the person submitting the proposal has familiarized himself with all conditions and intends to comply with them unless noted otherwise.

1. **Definitions:** The Term "Village" whenever used in the contract documents shall be construed to mean the Village of Oswego. The Village of Oswego, the IT Department, and the IT Manager shall also be known herein, respectively, as the Village, the Department, and the Manager.
2. **Conditions:** The Bidder is responsible for being familiar with all conditions, instructions, and documents governing this project and bid. Failure to make such investigation and preparations shall not excuse the Contractor from performance of the duties and obligations imposed under the terms of this contract. The bidder acknowledges that local ordinance permits the Village to give preference to local businesses.
3. **Bid Bond:** If the bidder's proposal for this project exceeds fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00), bids shall be secured by a certified check, bank draft, satisfactory bid bond or approved letter of credit in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the total project bid. Bid security shall be submitted with the bid.
4. **Performance Bond:** If the bidder's proposal for the project is equal to or greater than \$5,000 then the following bonds shall be delivered to the Village and shall become binding with the acceptance of the bid:
 - A. Performance bond satisfactory to the Village, executed by Surety Company authorized to do business in the state or otherwise secured in a manner satisfactory to the Village, in an amount equal to 110% of the price specified for the complete bid package. The surety on the bond shall be a company that is licensed by the Department of Insurance authorizing it to execute surety bonds and the company shall have a financial strength rating of at least A- as rated by A.M. Best Company, Inc., Moody's Investors Service, Standard & Poor's Corporation, or a similar rating agency.
5. **Insurance Requirements:** The Contractor will provide satisfactory proof of insurance naming the Village of Oswego, together with its officers, agents, employees and engineers as additional primary, non-contributory named insureds prior to commencing work. All policies shall be written on a "per occurrence" basis. The Contractor shall procure and maintain insurance for protection from claims under worker's compensation acts, claims for damages because of bodily injury including personal injury, sickness or disease or death of any and all employees or of any person other than such employees, and from claims or damages because of injury to or destruction of property including loss of use resulting therefrom, alleged to arise from the Contractor's negligence in the performance of services under this Agreement. Contractor's certificate of insurance shall contain a provision that the coverage afforded under the policy(s) will not be canceled or reduced without thirty (30) days prior written notice (hand delivered or registered mail) to the Village. Contractor shall promptly forward new certificate(s) of insurance evidencing the coverage(s) required herein upon annual renewal of the subject policies. Failure of the Contractor to supply a valid certificate of insurance, or if a previously valid certificate of insurance has expired and is not replaced, is grounds for issuance of a stop work order until such time as a valid certificate of insurance is provided. Failure of the Village to collect or demand a certificate of insurance shall not be deemed a waiver of the requirement to provide one. Installing Contractor's insurance becomes primary when the Village's vehicles are in their possession. The limits of liability for the insurance required by this Subsection shall not be less than the following:

6. **Force Majeure:** Whenever a period of time is provided for in this Agreement for the Contractor or the City to do or perform any act or obligation, neither party shall be liable for any delays or inability to perform if such delay is due to a cause beyond its control and without its fault or negligence including, without limitation: a) Acts of nature; b) Acts or failure to act on the part of any governmental authority other than the City or Contractor, including, but not limited to, enactment of laws, rules, regulations, codes or ordinances subsequent to the date of this Agreement; c) Acts of war; d) Acts of civil or military authority; e) Embargoes; f) Work stoppages, strikes, lockouts, or labor disputes; g) Public disorders, civil violence, or disobedience; h) Riots, blockades, sabotage, insurrection, or rebellion; i) Epidemics or pandemics; j) Terrorist acts; k) Fires or explosions; l) Nuclear accidents; m) Earthquakes, floods, hurricanes, tornadoes, or other similar calamities; n) Major environmental disturbances; or o) Vandalism. If a delay is caused by any of the force majeure circumstances set forth above, the time period shall be extended for only the actual amount of time said party is so delayed. Further, either party claiming a delay due to an event of force majeure shall give the other party written notice of such event within three (3) business days of its occurrence or it shall be deemed to be waived.

7. **Ineligible Contractors or Vendors:** The Contractor shall certify their review of the village debarment list found at www.oswegoil.org and to further comply with all provisions of Title 1-16-16 of the Village Code. Each proposal, bid or quotation must also include a listing of all intended subcontractors.

Bids received from any listed contractor in response to an invitation for bids shall be entered on the abstract of bids and rejected. Proposals, quotations, or offers received from any listed contractor shall not be evaluated for award or included in the competitive range, nor shall discussions be conducted with a listed offer or during a period of ineligibility. If the period of ineligibility expires or is terminated prior to award, the village may, but is not required to, consider such proposals, quotations, or offers.

8. **Compliance with Laws and Regulations:** In connection with the performance of the work, the Contractor shall comply with all statutes, laws, regulations, and orders of federal, state, county, or municipal authorities which shall impose any obligation or duty upon the Contractor.

9. **Contract Term: Base Bid Package #1, #2, & #3:** Contractor will have 45 days after receipt of order to deliver the specified items to the Village or designated location. **Base Bid Package #4:** Contractor will have 60 days after an official notice to proceed has been issued by the Village to complete the installation of all twenty-one (21) squad cars.

10. **Driver's License:** Before commencing work, the Contractor shall provide a copy of valid driver's license for each employee operating equipment in the Village. Drivers shall possess of Commercial Driver's License with appropriate endorsements if operating equipment that requires such a license.
11. **Change Orders:** After a contract is awarded pursuant to the competitive bid procedures specified herein, additional purchases or modifications may be made under the contract, or the terms of the contract may be extended, without rebidding the materials, supplies, services or equipment involved, provided that the change order:
- A. Is not of such a size or nature as to undermine the integrity of the original bidding process; and
 - B. Is germane to the original contract; and
 - C. Does not exceed twenty percent (20%) of the contracted amount; and
 - D. Is approved by the Board of Trustees or by the Village Administrator, or his/her designee for change orders that are not greater than fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00).
 - E. Change orders for contracts for public improvements shall be as provided by state law.
12. **Construction Contracts:** In addition to the bid and performance bonds set forth above, the bidder must furnish and pay for satisfactory any other security required by law or by the specifications for this particular project. Upon receipt of the performance bond, the Village will return the bid bond to the bidder.
- A. The bidder must comply with all applicable laws prerequisite to doing business in the state.
 - B. The bidder must have a valid Federal Employer Tax Identification Number or Tax Identification Number (for individuals).
 - C. The bidder must provide a Statement of Compliance with provisions of the State and Federal Equal Opportunity Employer requirements.
 - D. The bidder must provide evidence of any professional or trade license required by law or local ordinance for any trade or specialty area in which the Contractor is seeking a contract award. Additionally, the Contractor must disclose any suspension or revocation of such license held by the company, or of any director, officer or manager of the company. Any material changes to the Contractor's status, at any time, must be reported in writing to the Village within 14 days of its occurrence. Failure to comply with this requirement is grounds for the Contractor to be deemed non-responsible.
 - E. The bidder must provide the name and addresses of all known Subcontractors, the general type of work to be performed by these Subcontractors and the expected amount of money that each will receive under the contract. If at any time during the term of the contract a Contractor adds or changes any Subcontractors, he or she shall promptly notify, in writing, the Village Finance Director or their designee of the names and addresses of each new or replaced Subcontractor and the general type of work to be performed.
 - F. The bidder must provide an affidavit indicating all incomplete work under Contractor and all pending Contractors, along with a schedule of the expected completion of each such contract.
13. **Termination:** The Village shall have the right at any time and for any reason (without any penalty) to terminate, in whole or in part, this Contract, provided that the Village shall provide Contractor at least ten (10) days' prior written notice of such termination whereupon this Agreement shall automatically terminate immediately after the 11th day.
- A. When this contract, or any portion hereof, is terminated or cancelled by the Village, and the Contractor released before all items of work included in this contract have been completed, payment may be made be prorated as a percentage of completion of the actual work at contract unit prices, and no claims for loss of anticipated profits or other damages will be made and are hereby waived.
 - B. Termination of a contract, as stated above, will not relieve the Contractor or his/her surety of the responsibility of replacing defective work or materials.
14. **Additional Items:** The Village and Contractor further agree that
- A. **If the Prevailing Wage Act Applies:**
Wage Rate Requirements:

- (1) The Contract shall be based upon payment by Contractor and his Subcontractor of wage rates not less than the prevailing hourly wage rate for each classification of worker engaged on the work as determined by the State of Illinois, Department of Labor.
- (2) A copy of the wage determination shall be posted by the Contractor in a conspicuous place at the site of the work where it can be easily seen by the workers.
- (3) The Contractor shall maintain certified time sheets and submit to the Village with final invoice.
- (4) The Contractor will be required to sign a Wage Rate Requirement Certification.

B. Prevailing Wage

Some or all of the work herein may be subject to the provisions of Prevailing Wage Act, 820 ILCS 130/0.01 et.seq., providing for the payment of prevailing rate wages to all laborers, workmen and mechanics engaged on work. - C.  - 11) Penalties imposed for drug violations.
 - 12) Providing a copy of the Statement required by subsection (a) to each employee engaged in the performance of the Contract and to post the Statement in a prominent place in the workplace.

- 13) Notifying the contracting agency within ten (10) days after receiving notice of any violations as listed above.
- 14) Imposing a sanction on, or requiring the satisfactory participation in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program, by any employee who is so convicted, as required by Section 5 of the Drug Free Workplace Act.
- 15) Assisting employees in selecting a course of action in the event drug counseling, treatment, and rehabilitation are required and indicating that a trained referral team is in place.
- 16) Making a good faith effort to continue to maintain a drug free workplace through implementation of the Drug Free Workplace Act.
- 17) The Contractor will be required to sign a Drug Free Workplace Certification.

E. **Substance Abuse Prevention on Public Works Projects:** Before a contractor or subcontractor commences work on a public works project as defined in 820 ILCS 130/2, the contractor or subcontractor shall have in place a written program which meets or exceeds the program requirements in the Substance Abuse Prevention on Public Works Projects Act, to be filed with the public body engaged in the construction of the public works and made available to the general public, for the prevention of substance abuse among its employees. The Contract shall comply with the Employment of Public Works Act (30 ILCS 570/0.01), if applicable.

H. **Compliance with Laws and Regulations:** In connection with the performance of the work, the Contractor shall comply with all statutes, laws, regulations, and orders of federal, state, county, or municipal authorities which shall impose any obligation or duty upon the Contractor.

15. **Indemnity and Hold Harmless Agreement:** To the fullest extent permitted by law, Contractor shall indemnify, defend, save and hold the Village, its trustees, officers, employees, agents, attorneys and lenders (collectively the “Indemnitees”) harmless from and against all loss and expense (including, but not limited to, reasonable attorney’s fees and other costs and expenses) by reason of any liability or allegation of liability, against the Indemnitees, or any of them, for damages because of property damage or bodily injury, occupational sickness or disease, including death, resulting therefrom, while performing the work or while at the site where work under the Contract is being conducted or elsewhere, while engaged in the performance of Work under the Contract, however such injuries may be caused, whether attributable to a breach of statutory duty or administrative regulation or otherwise, and such injuries for which liability is imputed to the Indemnitees, or any of them, or damage or injury, directly or indirectly arising or alleged to arise out of the performance of or the failure to perform the work or the failure to protect the work or the site, or the condition of the work, the site, adjoining land or driveways, or streets or alleys used in connection with the performance of the work. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the defense and indemnity set forth in this section includes, subject only to the limitations contained in this section, all liabilities, damages, losses, claims, demands and actions on account of bodily injury, death or property loss to an Indemnitee or to any other person or entities, whether based upon, or claimed to be based upon, statutory, contractual, tort or other liability of any Indemnitee. In addition, such defense and indemnity shall include all liabilities, damages, losses, claims, demands and actions for defamation, false arrest, malicious prosecution or any other infringement or similar rights.

The provisions of the indemnity provided for herein shall not be construed to indemnify any Indemnitee for its own negligence. To the extent not permitted by law or to eliminate or reduce any other indemnification, right or remedy which the Village is otherwise entitled to assert. This provision shall survive completion, expiration, or termination of this Agreement.

If any claim indemnified hereunder has not been settled or discharged when the work is completed, final payment of the Contract Sum shall not be due, unless and until Contractor provides a bond or other security equal to 150% of the amount of such claim in a form and substance satisfactory to the Village. In any and all claims against any Indemnitee or any of its agents or employees by any employee of Contractor, anyone directly or indirectly employed by him or anyone for whose acts he may be liable, the indemnification obligation under this Section shall not be limited in any way by any limitation on the amount or type of damages, compensation or benefits payable by or for Contractor under Worker’s Compensation acts or other employees benefit acts.
