**EXECUTIVE ORDER OF THE VILLAGE PRESIDENT OF OSWEGO
IN RESPONSE TO COVID-19**

(Closures and Additional Orders)

WHEREAS, the number of confirmed cases of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) in Illinois and the United States continues to climb, further endangering Village residents; and,

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, I, Troy Parlier, Village President of Oswego, declared a Local State of Emergency to assist residents and ease certain Village regulations during the COVID-19 outbreak; and,

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, I issued Executive Order 2020-01, providing necessary relief to residents and businesses during this emergency, while also taking steps to protect the community from the spread of this virus; and,

WHEREAS, I have determined that several additional measures are required to reduce the risk of residents and Village staff contracting COVID-19 and to assist restaurants and bars that remain closed for dine-in customers per the Governor's Executive Order 2020-07;

NOW, THEREFORE, by the powers vested in me as the Village President of the Village of Oswego, and pursuant to Section 1-6-8 of the Oswego Village Code, Section 11-1-6 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-1-6), and Section 11 of the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act (20 ILCS 3305/11), **I HEREBY ORDER THE FOLLOWING:**

Section 1: Oswego Village Hall, 100 Parkers Mill, will be closed to members of the public beginning March 21, 2020. Residents should utilize the Village's website at www.oswegoil.org or phone number (630-554-3618) for general assistance. To pay bills online please visit css.oswegoil.org, and to apply for permits online please email BZinfo@oswegoil.org. Additionally, the bill pay box in front of Village Hall will still be operational.

Section 2: Oswego Police Headquarters, 3355 Woolley Road, will be closed to the public beginning March 21, 2020. Exceptions will be made in the case of an emergency. When responding to calls, police officers shall wear personal protective equipment when KenCom Dispatch states it is required or

when a police officer feels it is necessary due to a citizen displaying symptoms of COVID-19 or suspects the citizen has been exposed, and shall practice social distancing as appropriate. Many services, including filing of police reports, should be handled by phone, as practical.

Section 3: The Oswego Public Works Facility, 100 Theodore Drive, will be closed to the public beginning March 21, 2020. Public works employees will still handle repairs needed throughout the Village, as reported by residents online or by phone. Repairs related to the health and safety of Village residents will continue to be prioritized.

Section 4: All non-essential bids in response to the Village's previously issued notices seeking bids are postponed until after April 15, 2020 as set forth on the Village's website. All responses to Village Requests for Proposals must be submitted electronically during that period, according to the procedure detailed on the Village's website: <http://www.oswegoil.org/business-and-development/bids-and-rfps.aspx>.

Section 5: All currently active solicitor's licenses obtained through the Village are hereby suspended until April 15, 2020. No new solicitor's licenses shall be issued until that date.

Section 6: The Village shall not issue any special event permits until April 15, 2020.

Section 7: As Local Liquor Control Commissioner, any establishment that currently possesses a Village of Oswego liquor license allowing only "on-premises" sales of liquor shall be allowed to sell packaged alcohol for "off-premises" consumption through April 15, 2020, or until the termination or revocation of the Governor's ban of on-premises consumption as detailed in the Governor's Executive Order 2020-07, whichever occurs earlier.
