Community Traffic Update

In every city, village, or town the number one complaint will always be traffic related complaints. Speeding, distracted drivers on cellular phones, vehicles not stopping for pedestrians in crosswalks, stop sign violators, etc.

While ultimately the responsibility of traffic enforcement does lie with the Police Department, having proactive members of the community who have reasonable expectations is greatly appreciated. Since the police cannot be everywhere all the time, we rely on our community members to be our eyes and the best witnesses possible when it comes to reporting traffic related issues. As the old Jerry Maguire saying goes, "help me, help you!"

How can you help us as members of the community? If you observe what appears to be violations in your subdivisions, bring it to our attention. Record the time of day, vehicle information and even a license plate if you can obtain it. The Oswego Police Department has a Traffic Unit made up of highly motivated enforcement officers. Our goal is to gain compliance and safety through driver education and enforcement.

Through the use of message boards, speed data devices, pedestrian crosswalk signs, and social media our goal is to work smarter and be proactive.

Speed data signs are calibrated radar devices that allow us to gather and evaluate data through a range of options regarding vehicular volume and speed. This device will collect data and provide us with variable readings that we look at to determine validity and continuous enforcement.

It takes all of us to keep our community safe. We all have to do our part while driving on the roadway. Stay off our phones, watch our speed in the subdivisions and be courteous/defensive drivers.
